**KANEOHE CONTINUES WINNING FORM AT SECOND REGATTA  
KOA KAI PROGRAM STEADY  
WAIKIKI BEACH BOYS MAKING A COMEBACK**

**HONOLULU (June 6, 2004)** – **Kane'ohe Canoe Club**, not content to rest on its laurels from 2003 and out to prove its win last week was no fluke, raced an error free regatta today and scored an impressive 92 points, closing in on the elusive 100 point mark not seen in Hui Wa'a since the early 1990s. **Manu O Ke Kai**, this week's host using its home field advantage, also showed its performance from last week was the 'real deal' as the club once again finished in second place for large clubs with 55 points, winning both Golden Master Men and Women's races and all the open men's races (Freshman, Sophomore, and Senior). **Lokahi**, still reeling from a shaky start last week, improved its performance to edge closer to Manu O Ke Kai and round out the large club division with 52 points. Race infractions resulting in disqualification once again robbed Lokahi of crucial points.

**Koa Kai**, dominate in the medium club division last year, continues to stand out in this group, amassing points with a well-balanced attack. Koa Kai's men, women, and teens all contributed to the club's overall success. **Waikiki Yacht Club** finished a distance second place in the AA division and just edged out Ke'ehi Lagoon based **'Alapa Hoe** 13-12.

The **Waikiki Beach Boys Canoe Club**, one of the oldest clubs in Hui Wa'a and once one of the larger clubs in the association's history, seems to be staging a comeback albeit in the small club division (A division) on the strength of its women and novice programs. The men at the Waikiki Beach Boys do their share however garnering points for the club in the Mix Open 6, Mix Novice B, and Freshman races en route to the club's overall 28 point total. **Na Keiki O Ka Mo'i** of Waianae and **North Shore** of Haleiwa make this an entertaining division as they battled for second and third place with 20 and 17 points respectively. The Open 4 men of Na Keiki O Ka Mo'i and the Master 40+ women of North Shore have distinguished themselves over the past few seasons as crews to watch.
